The Organ

The present organ was built in 1991 by Australian Pipe Organs, restoring and expanding the 1866 Fincham organ. 2 manuals, 18 speaking stops, 8 couplers. Gt: 8.8.4.4.2.III. Sw: 8.8.8.4.2.III.8. Ped: 16.16.10-2/3.8.4.

The Old Cathedral's organist is David Brown. David undertook studies as an organ scholar at the Universities of Cambridge and St Andrews, and is currently also Organist at Scotch College.

The Bells

Melbourne's first peal of bells were the six bells hung in St James' Cathedral in 1853, replacing an old ship's bell. Two more were added in 1885. All were cast by Mears and Stainbank of Whitechapel Road, London, and are reputed to be the finest ever cast there. They are still rung regularly by a team of volunteers.

COVID Safety at St James' Old Cathedral

Please help us keep everyone safe and compliant with government regulations.

- 1. Masks are now optional indoors.
- **2. Everyone is required to register.** Please use the QR codes at the entrance or in the pews. The same code suffices for the whole site so there is no separate registration for the conference centre.

- **8. Communion** will be provided in both kinds. For simplicity we will all use the biodegradable individual cups of non-alcoholic wine usually offered as an alternative to the common cup. The reintroduction of the common cup is not yet permitted.
- **9. Doors** may be left open to improve ventilation.
- **10.** The clergy will **greet** you at the door after the service but without handshakes. Please greet each other the same way. The greeting of the peace will be a liturgical response only.
- 11. **Social gathering** after church may include tea and coffee service and food offered indoors. Self-service is still prohibited.

This Advent Sunday the hymn *Conditor alme siderum* (Creator of the Stars of Night) is being played on bells across Australia to commemorate the 700th anniversary of the first mechanical clock to play a named tune, installed in St Catherine's Monastery, Rouen, France, in 1321. The hymn was traditionally played during Advent, and when played on the clock reminded hearers of the glory of God's creation and the connection between themselves, time, and the cosmos. This event is a collaboration between churches, secular musicians, and the Australian Research Council project *The Sounds of Time* directed by Dr Matthew Champion, a member of St James' Old Cathedral.
